From the Pastor's Pen

I struggle to believe I have been your pastor for eleven months. For me, I have found our time together to be a blessing. I anticipate working with you as we try to discern what our ministry looks like in a post-pandemic world. One of my goals for the next year is to start a discernment process focused on God's dreams for us here at Evangelical.

For the last few weeks, in our sermons, we explored how to share the good news we find in Jesus. "Why Jesus?" is the name of the sermon series and the central question. Each week, we focused on a different reason for having a relationship with Jesus. My hope is these sermons help you answer the question for yourselves. When we can answer the question for our own lives, we can share that answer with others.

In the 2021-2022 appointment year (United Methodist pastors serve from July 1 through June 30 with the possibility of being reappointed to the same church the following year), I would like us to focus on the question "why Evangelical?" One way to wrestle with the question "why Evangelical?" is to ponder what makes us unique as a church. Each of you could name reasons "why Evangelical?", or you would not be part of our church family. I invite us to pray over the question "why Evangelical?" Thank you all for a blessed year. I pray we have more together.

Help grow "Addicted to Christ" ministry.

Ron Martin is organizing this fundraiser.

"Addicted to Christ" is a new Biblical Counseling Ministry, the purpose of which is to reach the outcast and unloved, the addicted, and the prison-bound or ex-prisoner. It is operated by Rev. Ron Martin, an ordained ecumenical pastor in Dewy Rose, Georgia. Pastor Ron holds an Associate's in Christian Ministry, and is currently enrolled in a Bachelor's program. He is a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors, and pastors a small local fellowship.

Pastor Ron is a volunteer worker for Gospel Express Ministries, a prison ministry located in North Carolina. He and his wife work directly with inmate mentoring and Bible studies.

The ministry's purpose is to reach those who are otherwise addicted, and to help them get addicted instead to Christ. It is based on Luke 14:7 and is intended to give the person who feels emptiness a confidential ear to hear. It will benefit those who want help, but don't have anyone to talk to.

The ministry is open to ALL who thirst for freedom in the Lord; it is a 100% Christian organization. Funds are needed to build a proper office/counseling space, support the financial needs of the ministry (Bibles, supplies, administration, etc.), and for outreach until the ministry can become self-supporting. A building is owned, but internal subdivision is needed. Lumber costs are out of this world, and this financial assistance would mean the world to this fledgling ministry.

There are a lot of people in deep need, especially now. Help me to help them.



The reopening task force met to discuss several issues on Monday, May 17, 2021. The meeting began with the statistics for our area: PA PCR % positivity rate 7 day average is at 5.3%, for Dauphin county it is at 7.8%, indoor capacity is now at 50% and 48.8% of people have been vaccinated in PA. The members of this committee take very seriously their responsibility and are doing their best to keep everyone safe during this ongoing pandemic. After much discussion and prayer, you will find below a summary of the results of this meeting.

Communion – Supplies have been ordered to safely share communion, this will begin on the first Sunday after arrival, watch bulletin for announcement.

Worship Services – May 23 will be the last time for the 9am service due to low attendance, the sanctuary is large enough to accommodate all together at 10:15am.

Adult Sunday School - On Sunday June 6, in the education wing, classes will resume.

Children's Church – On Sunday, May 30 Children's Church will resume.

Choir – The small group of singers will be moving up into the choir loft and may be joined by a few additional members.

Committee Meetings – All meetings will continue via Zoom for now.

Masks – Signs will remain up; all are encouraged to continue wearing.

Congregational Singing – Pastor will continue to ask all to sing with their hearts but if one feels led to sing may do so softly under your mask.


Memorial Services – A request for a service has been made and it was decided that as long as all current guidelines are followed it could proceed.
