TECHNOLOGY PROJECT

At our September meetings, the Finance committee and the Church Council accepted a proposal submitted by Pastor Andrew for a Technology Project. This project covers three major needs. The highest priority is the church office's computer. We are having major issues with it and have had to contact outside support to fix it twice. The estimated cost for this computer and accessories is \$2006. The next priority would be the pastor's office computer and accessories. This would be an estimated \$1791. And lastly would be to create a Zoom Room at an estimated cost of \$4350.

What is a Zoom Room?

For our church, it will be transforming meeting room 3, in the education wing, into a video conferencing space. When installed, we hope to have our meetings allow people to come in-person or join us by phone or a video via Zoom. In addition to meetings, Pastor Andrew hopes to offer Bible studies in the room and possibly a new Sunday School class. Other groups at Evan would be welcome to use the space for their meetings and events. Below is a picture of some of the equipment that will be installed.

The total cost of this project is an estimated \$8147. Prices keep changing, there is a chip shortage, prices are high, and availability is low. We will only be able to make purchases as donations are available. You will find an envelope in this newsletter marked TECHNOLOGY PROJECT. These envelopes are also available at the church in the back of the sanctuary near the offering plates. Please consider donating to this project. We have received \$1380 dollars for the project. Thank you to everyone who has supported the project so far!
